The Power of Education

My father could not read or write. He had never gone to school. Our father however was one of those Gikuyus who as a young man saw the “white man”, come and settle in Kikuyu country, early in the 1900’s.

Born in Kiambaa in the Kiambu District my father belonged to the Gikuyu age-group known as Kienjeku.

The Gikuyu of my father’s generation were among the earliest Gikuyus to notice the value of education. As the first white men settled in Gikuyu and Thika



area, the Gikuyu of my father's age noticed that the white man was able to do many things which the African was not able to do. At times it appeared to the Gikuyu of my father's generation that the white man had some magical powers because of the things he was able to do.

As they observed the many things the white man was able to do almost by magic the Gikuyu of my father's generation came to one important conclusion: that the power of the white man lay in one thing----- "githomo;" education.

After this discovery many Gikuyus of my father's generation did everything they could to make sure their children got this magic power called githomo-education. They sent their children to school.

My parents made every effort to make sure that all their children, fourteen of them, went to school and got as much education as they could.

When our parents moved from Kiambaa and settled in Kangundo, Machakos, my two elder sisters Susan and Loise were the first girls in the whole of Ukambani, to complete the Primary School. This was in 1941. They were enrolled at the Mission School in Kangundo.

Unfortunately my sisters could not continue to High School, because in 1941 there was only one high school in Kenya, the Alliance High School in Kikuyu which, was for boys only. At any rate to the American missionaries in Kangundo, Kikuyu was too far for a young girl to go for education.

Passing the baton

The magic of the power of education is

no less today than it was for my father's generation.

I see the Riara Schools and especially the Riara University as the natural continuation of the effort started by the old man Gachukia and others of his generation early in the 20th century, to provide quality education to young Kenyans.

Today University education is opening up new horizons for Kenyans young and old. Communication in all its forms has opened new fields of education and innovation.

The message is clear to those of my generation today. We must not drop the relay button handed over to us by the generation of our forefathers in the last century.

To those who are graduating today and have therefore the honor of being the first graduates of the Riara University I would like to say this; Graduation is not the end of education. It is only the beginning of a long journey of learning and discovery. This is why at Riara we call this ceremony "Commencement" As you leave Riara read more books to expand your mind's horizon. Be prepared to research and innovate. I can assure you that you will find your effort and the experience rewarding.

faith; from I am to we are; from blending in to standing out; from patchiness to excellence; from being served to selfless service; from dreaming to realizing your aspirations.

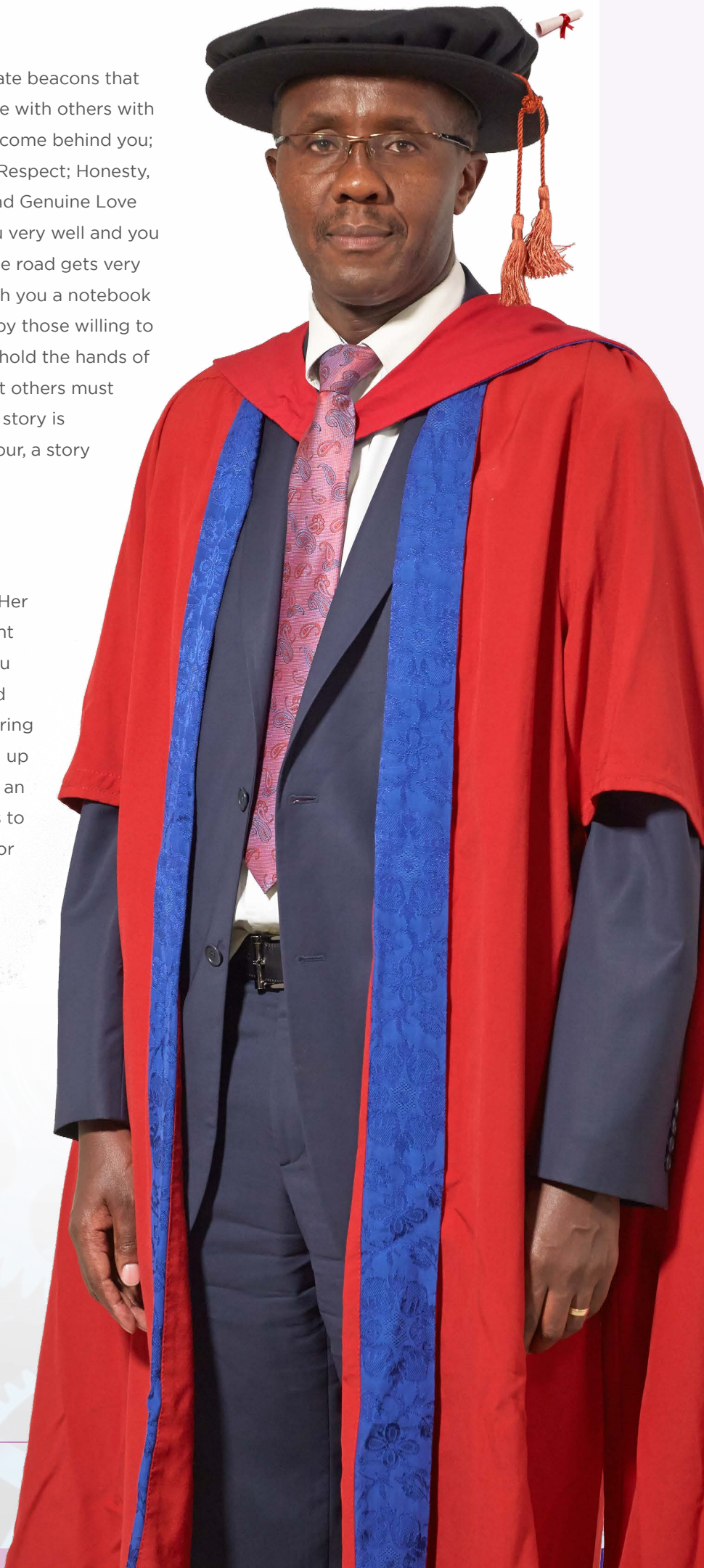

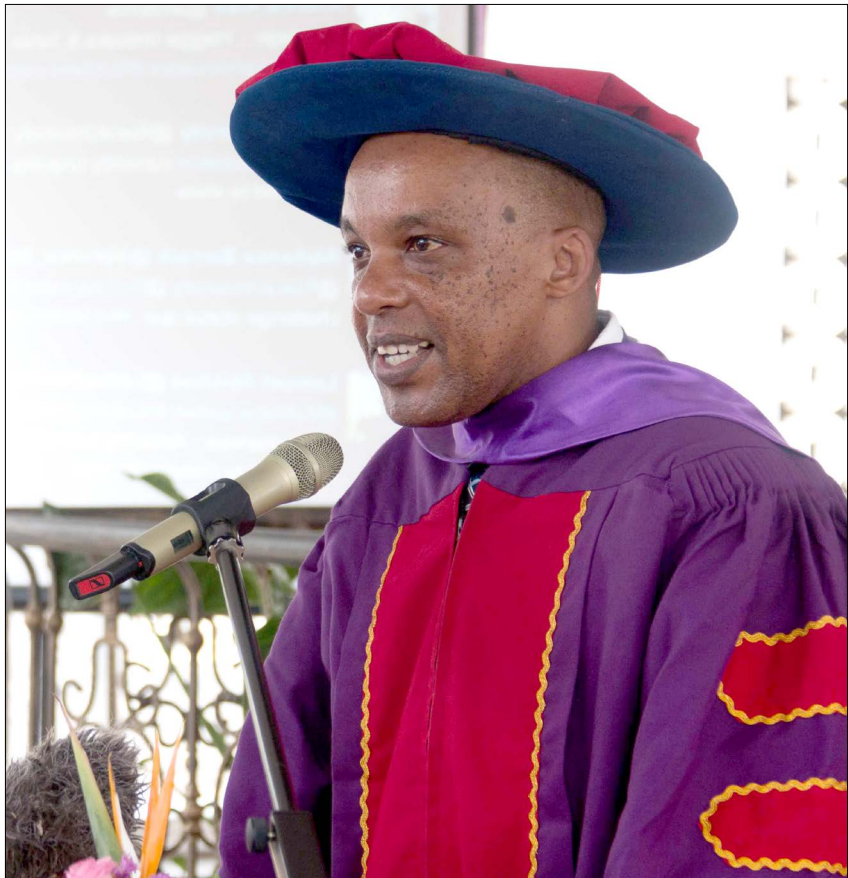

In the years to come, I imagine that our young brothers and sisters starting out today would want to look back and say they truly achieved the timeless ideal. A few will probably capture this success in written memoirs to be passed onto future generations. You would be excused for wondering how your journey will unfold and how successful you will be at being timeless.

Indeed the big question is why do some people thrive continually, achieve a respectable measure of success and a positive impact on society while others fade away soon after leaving school? Remain 'aggressively' humble for indeed there will always be greater and lessor persons than your



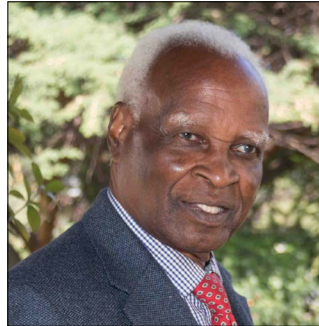
